Was Congress Listening?

"I ask this Congress to declare that women should earn a living equal to their efforts, and finally pass the Paycheck Fairness Act this year."

- President Obama, State of the Union address, February 12, 2013

Did you watch President Obama's speech? Not only did the president talk pay in his State of the Union address—we like to think at the urging of all our activists over the past week—he explicitly called for Congress to pass the Paycheck Fairness Act. As you know, this is one of our top legislative priorities, and an issue that our community has been advocating for years. With our nation's lawmakers focused on what we can achieve together to improve the state of our union, now is the time for us to raise our voices even louder than before and make sure Congress pays attention.

In addition to the Paycheck Fairness Act, the president laid out an ambitious agenda on many of AAUW's priorities. While there are administrative actions President Obama can take to further those priorities, and while we will continue to urge him to take those actions, responsibility also lies with the people he was speaking to in the room—Congress. We must hold our members of Congress accountable for their action (or inaction) on the Paycheck Fairness Act; advancing a balanced approach to deficit reduction; helping prevent school violence by making our schools free from harassment and bullying; passing an inclusive Violence Against Women Act (VAWA); increasing access to preschool education; and improving education opportunities in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM).

Send a message to your members of Congress today and urge them to act on these key priorities laid out in the president's State of the Union address.

Together, we can change the state of the union – it starts with us, and it starts with Congress.
