PUBLIC POLICY

When I thought about focusing this month's article on reproductive rights, I couldn't decide if I was brave or stupid. Clearly, this is one of the most divisive issues of our time and an individual's point of view often marks on which side of the culture wars she stands. AAUW's position is clear: AAUW believes in the right to privacy, freedom from violence, and choice in the determination of one's reproductive life. This does not mean that AAUW is in favor of abortion. It does mean AAUW is opposed to legal efforts to limit access to safe abortions as part of a comprehensive approach to reproductive freedom.

This makes sense from the point of view that if women are to achieve their potential in this world, they must be educated and have economic options. This is only possible if we can control the number of children we bear and the time and circumstances under which we choose to have them.

Many of us believed this was settled law, but over the last few years we have seen a growing attempt at the state level to erode women's reproductive rights. 2012 saw more than 40 laws in 19 states designed to limit access to constitutionally protected abortions. 2011 was worse and, while the numbers aren't in for 2013, they don't appear to be any better. These laws include nonsensical requirements about building codes in abortion clinics, doctors in clinics needing privileges at local hospitals and fetal "personhood" laws. A new attack is the current attempt to void the protection for contraceptive services in the Affordable Care Act. It's worth noting that the employer contraceptive coverage requirements predate the ACA. In December 2000, the Equal Opportunity Commission ruled that employers who provided prescription drug coverage but not contraception were in violation of Title VII of the 1964 Civil Rights Act, which prohibits sex-based discrimination. That ruling still stands, today.

According to AAUW Action Network (11-27-13) "more than 40 for-profit companies have sued for the right to deny their employees access to this contraceptive coverage. Hobby Lobby, a for-profit arts and crafts chain, which wants to deny its employees this benefit, leads this effort. These companies want the right to put themselves between women and their doctors."

The Supreme Court will hear this case and that, in and of itself, represents a danger to all Americans. It fosters the notion that corporate personhood extends to the right of employers to force their own religious beliefs on their employees. This may start with contraception and women but it likely won't end there. AAUW urges each of us to take action on this issue. Stay aware of this case and take the time to write a letter to the editor and let your legislators know what you think.

Well, the brave vs. stupid debate may still be raging. I'm hoping it's moot and you come down on the side of "informative."
