Guide to Action for the Ratification of UN Convention on the Rights of the Child

In 1989, The United Nations General Assembly unanimously adopted the Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC). It was the first international treaty to integrate human rights as they apply to children. It supports children's right to survival, development, and protection against abuse, neglect and exploitation and to participate in family, cultural and social aspects of life. Other critical Convention issues include education, health care, juvenile justice and the rights of children with

disabilities. The Convention defines a child as any human being under the age of eighteen, unless the age of majority is attained earlier under a state's own domestic legislation.

The United States government played an active role in the drafting of the Convention. It commented on nearly all of the articles, and proposed the original text for seven of them. Three of these came directly from the United States Constitution and were proposed by the administration of President Ronald Reagan. The Convention was adopted by the UN General Assembly on 20 November 1989 and went into effect on 2 September 1990. On 16 February 1995, Madeleine Albright, U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations, signed the Convention. However, neither President Bill Clinton, who was generally supportive, nor President Bush submitted the Convention to the Senate. President Barack Obama has described the failure to ratify the Convention as 'embarrassing' and has promised to review.

WG-USA (Women Graduates) recognizes that as Americans, we know that children should come first. Ratifying the UNCRC would solidify global support for the rights of children and families. It's not that the U.S. does not recognize the rights of children, as it has signed and ratified the Optional Convention Protocol on the Involvement of Children in Armed Conflict and the Optional Protocol on the Sale of Children, Child Prostitution and Child Pornography, a priority issue for WG-USA.

Please take the time to urge your legislators to get this important convention ratified by the U.S. Time is running out for our children. To date, the United States is the only UN member not to have ratified UNCRC.

Why has the name changed from AAUW Funds to AAUW Fund?

Our association has changed the name of its national philanthropic mission from AAUW Funds to AAUW Fund. Although this may seem to be a small difference they have done so to emphasize that *all* our donations go into the same fund that advances AAUW's mission by sustaining *all* our programs and activities. When individual members make donations to AAUW Fund they may make them unrestricted, which means they can be used wherever most needed. But, if members have a favorite area they wish to specify they may continue to do so. This would include specific endowments which support the Fellows such as the speaker we had in October, Adriana Romero Olivares, or Grants. Or members may wish to support the Legal Advocacy Fund (LAF), the Eleanor Roosevelt Foundation (Research) or the Public Policy Fund.

Unrestricted AAUW Fund would support such programs as the National Conference of College Women Student Leaders, (NCCWSL), the Younger Women's Task Force, the Outlook Magazine, Tech Savvy, Elect Her and Start Smart. If you want to know more about any of these areas check out the AAUW website: auw.org which will tell you everything you would want to know!

So, whether you give an unrestrictive gift to AAUW Fund, or designate a certain program, I hope you will give before the end of the calendar year, December 31. 
MATH/SCIENCE CONFERENCE FOR 8TH GRADE GIRLS
