President's Message

As your president I want to keep you up to date on what's happening at the National, State, and local level.

National News

Yovino v. Rizo (Formerly Rizo v. Fresno County Office of Education)
Aileen Rizo's fight for fair pay continues.

On August 30, 2018, Fresno County Superintendent of Schools filed a petition for appeal with the Supreme Court of the United States to challenge the decision reached by the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit, which found in favor of Aileen holding that using prior salary alone, as a "factor other than sex," or in combination with other factors cannot justify a wage differential under the Equal Pay Act. On February 25, 2019, the Supreme Court vacated and remanded the Ninth Circuit's decision, which means that they determined that the Ninth Circuit's decision was flawed and must be sent back to the appellate court for additional review. The Court arrived at this conclusion without reviewing the merits of the equal pay case, focusing solely on the second issue presented before the Court, which was whether a federal court could count the vote of a judge who dies before the decision is issued. This was relevant because the judge who authored the Ninth Circuit decision died on March 29, 2018, although the vote was taken and opinion authored prior to his death. AAUW has been fighting for Aileen and others by advocating for pay equity and fairness in compensation and benefits as a means to achieve economic self-sufficiency for all women. We will continue to support her case through our legal case support program.

State News

The 2019 AAUW California Annual Meeting will be held at Handlery Hotel, San Diego, April 6. 2019. The mission of your California State Board is to facilitate California branches in meeting the vision and mission of AAUW by providing programs, education, and resources. Based on feedback from branch presidents and others, the state has three priorities, "Expanding Branch Connections and Communications," "Reinforcing Public Policy Advocacy and Education" and "Strengthening Branch Infrastructure." All this information will be shared with the attendees at the morning business meeting. In addition, candidates for the 2019-2021 term will be introduced. Branches that have been selected for recognition for outstanding mission-based programs will also be introduced.

Branch News

Piper Lowinger spoke at our March 9, 2019 meeting about her experience at the National Conference for College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL). She shared with us how that experience gave her insight to her potential as a leader. We will hear more from Piper about her plans to implement what she learned at Whittier College this year and next. In addition, Karen Romero, our new NCCWSL candidate, was introduced at the meeting. The two of them will be such a positive influence at Whittier College in the future.

Thanks to all the Greater Whittier Area Branch members who attended the LACIC meeting, *Bridging the Generation Gap*, Sunday, March 10, 2019. Much was shared on the lessons we can learn from each generation, including the importance of follow-up with persons and programs that we support. Our own Karen Romero, was on the panel representing Gen Z. She expressed thanks for receiving the NCCWSL Grant. She learned about AAUW's mission and now she can encourage young members such as herself to join and support AAUW.

Several members from our Branch will be attending the Annual Meeting in San Diego on April 6, 2019. A big "shout-out" and congratulations goes to **Sharon Heck,** as our Branch will receive recognition for our Math/Science Conference at the general meeting as an outstanding mission-based program. PUBLIC POLICY

The following article was prepared by AAUW-CA in honor of Equal Pay Day, April 2, 2019 and sent to us by Ginny Hatfield, a member of the State Public Policy Committee and of the Los Angeles County Interbranch Council (LACIC). Equal Pay Day is the symbolic date on which women's earnings catch up to men's earnings from the prior year.



Imagine an America Without a Pay Gap

It is common knowledge that a woman in the United States makes 80 cents per dollar made by a man of similar qualifications. The pay gap is worse for women of color. In an era when women make up nearly 50% of the workforce, this pay gap burdens individual family finances and the economy. A recent study estimated the impact on society if the pay gap were corrected.

How would closing the pay gap be expected to impact families?

- -60% of working women and 66% single working mothers would see an increase in their pay
- -Poverty rates for working women would drop by half from 8% to 3.8%
- -Poverty rates for single working mothers would drop from 28.9% to 14.5%

How would the US economy benefit?

- -Closing the pay gap would increase gross domestic product an estimated \$500 million, roughly 2.6% of the GDP of our entire nation
- -The increase in women's earnings would be roughly 16 times what federal and state governments spent in 2015 for temporary assistance to needy families

The pay gap adversely impacts American families. Closing it would raise many out of poverty and reduce the need for public assistance. The question to ask our elected officials is not whether we as a society can afford to pay men and women the same income for the same work. The question is, how can we afford not to?

Equal Pay Day for Black Women does not occur until August 22 and for Latina Women until November 20. 
