She oversees a clinical staff of about thirty bicultural-bilingual mental health professionals and an outreach program for domestic violence and sexual assault delivering services in Los Angeles, Orange, San Bernardino and Riverside Counties.

Hurrah, Ladies. The Legal Advocacy Fund (LAF) supported a case <u>Portz v. St Cloud State</u> <u>University</u> which was decided **in favor** of the female student athletes of that institution. It seems the university wanted to drop the women's tennis team and the women's Nordic ski team. Instead, the judge stated that SCSU had not only to maintain those women's teams but improve the facilities of the women's sports teams to create equity with the men's teams. This judgment was based on compliance with *Title 1X* which advocates, among other provisions, against discrimination in women's sports. The judge reminded the university that though the court was mindful of financial difficulties faced by public universities that the school still could implement a cost-savings plan that did not result in discrimination against women.

Needless to say, such progress for women and girls is why we all support and donate to AAUW.



PUBLIC POLICY

While we are not having a state or federal election this year, fall brings thoughts of voting and voting, at least to me, brings thoughts of gerrymandering (OK, I admit I am odd.) You could be excused if gerrymandering isn't something you have thought about since the 5th Grade. It is probably one of the most complicated issues in electoral politics.

To simplify, gerrymandering involves drawing political boundaries so as to benefit one party over the others. What it does is destroy the notion of "one person, one vote" and is often used to dilute the impact of minority voters.

This image is from the Washington Post (2015) and is the best graphic explanation of gerrymandering that I can find. You can see how various schemes and oddly drawn districts allow a party in power to maintain power despite not having numerical superiority in actual voters.



Every ten years, district lines are redrawn. Gerrymandering perpetuates whichever party is in power by allowing that party to be in charge of the redistricting. California has changed that to put an independent commission in charge of drawing districts. Other states are making similar attempts. A Wisconsin case went all the way to the Supreme Court but was turned back to the lower courts when the SC ruled that the parties contesting the redistricting did not have "standing." (See, I said it was complex.)

We will let AAUW have the last word. From the national website, "AAUW has long advocated expanding <u>voting rights</u> and <u>ensuring equitable</u> political <u>participation</u> and <u>representation</u>. But poorly drawn or purposefully unfair electoral district lines can threaten these ideals. With the 2020 census looming, many advocates, legislators, and judges are taking a hard look at their electoral district boundaries."

Pay attention. Take action when needed and keep supporting the notion of "one person, one vote." Oh, did I hear someone mention that something like 21 states whose combined population is not as large as California, have 42 senators while California has 2? Talk about a complex issue! Maybe we will tackle that later on.

Please share with me your thoughts for subjects we should explore or your point of view on the issues or any questions about policy.






