Our first program of 2020 is a very special one. We are not only having a past recipient of an AAUW Fund Fellowship, but one who is teaching here at Whittier College as a Visiting Assistant Professor of English, **Bethany Wong**. With degrees from the University of Pennsylvania, the University of Edinburgh and her Ph.D. from the University of California at Santa Barbara, she focused her research on questions of gendered authorship, performance and play.

Her talk, "The Privilege of Play: Educating Women Past and Present," will focus on what early novels can teach us about women and education. She will propose play as the benchmark for appreciating the important work women have done in the past, are doing in the present and will do in the future. Play is often a privilege rather than a right. She will use the character of Fanny Price in Jane Austen's *Mansfield Park* to expand on this concept. Come hear how this relates to how University women cannot advance in their fields without organizations such as AAUW to offer them the time and resources to succeed. PUBLIC POLICY

Do a Google search on, "Violence Against Women" and you will get over 500,000,000 hits. Does that sound insane? Why? Violence against Women whether sexual or nonsexual exists in every culture, cuts across race, religion and socio-economic status. It impacts virtually every industry in one way or another, as evidenced by the recent spotlight on the entertainment industry.

According to the World Health Organization (WHO, November 2017) it is a MAJOR public health problem. WHO particularly hones in on intimate partner violence, which they claim is the most prevalent, and they state that 30% of women who have been in a relationship report that they have experienced some form of physical and/or sexual violence by their intimate partner in their lifetime. Globally, as many as 38% of murders of women are committed by a male intimate partner. There is enough data out there for hundreds of scholarly books and articles dealing with every aspect of this scourge, and ample evidence to suggest that the causes are myriad but have much to do with the still extant notion that women are property or the fear of women on the part of poorly-educated males who themselves lack upward social mobility.

Today, I want to concentrate on our US policies on violence against women. In 1994 Senators Biden (D- MD) and Hatch (R-UT) co-authored the Violence Against Women Act. It had broad bi-partisan support and passed easily. The act was reauthorized in 2000 and 2005. In 2010, its reauthorization was opposed by conservatives because of protection of same-sex domestic partners; however it passed.

The Government shutdown of 2018-2019 caused the act to expire without reauthorization. The House of Representatives passed a bill reauthorizing VAWA in April 2019 and includes new provisions protecting <u>transgender</u> victims and banning individuals convicted of domestic abuse from purchasing <u>firearms</u>. It does not include provisions against Female Genital Mutilation, nor does it include measures to deter so-called "honor" killings, sex-trafficking or forced child-marriages (though there are other laws that can be used to prosecute those offenses).

While Senators Feinstein (D-CA) and Ernst (R-IA) have been seeking a bi-partisan solution for months, one has not been reached. The major sticking point seems to be "the boyfriend loophole," i.e., husbands convicted of domestic abuse are prohibited from gun-ownership, boyfriends are not. The National Rifle Association does not want to close the "boyfriend loophole." They are lobbying hard against it, making it difficult for many senators who get many millions of dollars from them to oppose them

In the interest of "just the facts," I will keep my editorial comments to myself.

THE SPOTLIGHT




As promised, our new column highlighting member milestones is here. It's the SPOTLIGHT!

The 2020 books were distributed at our January meeting. If you were not present, contact me and I will see that you receive your book. The cost is \$24. My phone # is: 562-698-0476.


