
MATH/SCIENCE CONFERENCE FOR 8TH GRADE GIRLS




INTERNATIONAL CONCERNS

Here is some information on our book for January 18, 2023.

"The masterful first novel in the Martin Beck series of mysteries by the internationally renowned crime writing duo Maj Sjowall and Per Wahloo, finds Beck hunting for the murderer of a lonely traveler. On a July afternoon, a young woman's body is dredged from Sweden's beautiful Lake Vattern. With no clues, Beck begins an investigation not only to uncover a murderer but also to discover who the victim was. Three months later, all Beck knows is that her name was Roseanna and that she could have been strangled by any one of eighty-five people on a cruise. As the melancholic Beck narrows the list of suspects, he is drawn increasingly to the enigma of the victim, a free-spirited traveler with a penchant for casual sex, and to the psychopathology of a murderer with a distinctive—indeed, terrifying—sense of propriety. There are ten books in the series."

Happy New Year! We start 2023 by reading and discussing Louise Erdrich's <u>*The Sentence*</u>, on <u>Monday, January 23, at 10 AM</u>, led by Linda Harris. Set in the Minneapolis community around a fictional version of Erdrich's Birchbark Books from November 2019 to November 2020, this is not a ghost story, but a story with a ghost. The store's most annoying customer, Flora, dies on All Souls' Day and won't leave the store. Tookie, who works there, survived an earlier prison sentence by reading "with murderous attention." Throughout the book she tries to solve the mystery of the haunting while providing pitch-perfect book suggestions to the store's readers (lists included at the end of this book!), dealing with the pandemic, and navigating friendships, family issues, and community relationships. <u>*The Sentence*</u> asks what we owe to the living, the dead, to the reader, and to the book. Shortlisted for the 2022 Women's Prize for Fiction.

By 2007, it was 41 cents and the first Forever stamp was issued. If you have one today, it can still be used to mail a letter instead of the current 60 cents. *But wait, postage will go up again on January 22, 2023, to 63 cents!* So, you may want to consider buying some Forever stamps before then; at 60 cents they will be good forever, regardless of future increases.
