

In November, participants were reading Part 1: Chapters 1-3 and Part 2: Chapters 4-5. In preparation, it was suggested that each reader take 2 or 3 of the Harvard Implicit Bias Tests.

December-January Reading: Part 2: Chapters 4-5 and Part 3: Chapters 6-7


Part 2: Chapters 4 and 5 focus on privilege and its implications in social justice issues. Terms meritocracy, social categories and ordinary privilege are key to understanding the content.


Part 3: Chapters 6-7 addresses issues of white racial identity and gender identity. These are introduced through anecdotal models of Dolly Chugh and author Jodi Picoult. Readers learn what it means to "otherize people."

If you are reading the book, be sure you have contacted me so that I can send you more information on the discussion questions, more detailed summaries of the content, and articles of interest related to the reading.


INTERNATIONAL CONCERNS

Then she went to UC Riverside after teaching junior high for a year and earned her Master's in English Literature and teaching on the college campus. She taught high school and college English for over 30 years mostly in the Chaffey Jt. Unified H.S. District and at UC Riverside, Citrus, Mt. San Antonio Community College and So. California Business Colleges before retiring in 2019.
