WE'RE GAINING MOMENTUM...We are pleased to announce that, as of early December, 40 young women leaders from across California have registered for Gov Trek 2024!

Greater Whittier Branch has distributed information and invitations to students at 8 area high schools and we've communicated with LEARN LA after-school coordinators to promote the program to their students.

The State AAUW Gov Trek team's aim is to have 140 students in the program, and they need at least 50 girls registered to proceed. With your help, we can inspire more women to step up and take the lead! Together, let's drive the change we want to see and elevate more women to leadership roles.

VOTE411

The new Voter Education website for 2024 from League of Women Voters is VOTE411. Beginning in January information about candidates running for state, county, and local offices will begin to be posted. The League invites candidates to participate but does not have the means to make candidates participate. In LA County there will be over 500 candidates so inviting candidates and encouraging participation is a big job. Just at the county level there are 9 Judicial seats and 24 candidates, 12 running for District Attorney, and 3 Supervisor seats with 12 candidates including the 3 incumbents. The site has a different format from VotersEdge.org but will have good information including questions asked by the League. Check it out in mid-January.

MYRA LONG SCHOLARSHIP FUND (MLSF)

Committee Meeting Report

The committee met on November 7, 2023, and all the committee members were present.

Math/Science Conference will have 375 eighth-grade girls attend. There will be 20 presenters. Since Rowland Heights and El Rancho school districts will be on inter-season break, the number of students from the other middle schools has increased. We have backpacks already printed.

Carole Restovich, Scholarship Chairperson has worked with Rio Hondo Community College to have our scholarships advertised campus-wide.

Plus, she has met several teachers who will promote the availability of the MLSF. We will expand the High School scholarships to three schools.

The committee will offer a total \$5,000 in Special Grants to teachers. This has been a popular way to assist individual teachers to meet their goals.

Our budget has \$6,000 set aside to send five 13-year-old girls to Tech Trek. We are not sure of the cost for each camper at Whittier College. The number of five campers has been submitted to California State AAUW.

MYSTERY MAVENS

Mystery Mavens will meet at 6 PM, Wednesday, January 17, 2024, at The Original Roadhouse Grill, 15156 Whittier Blvd., Whittier, CA 90603, near Whittwood. Our January 17 book will be <u>Sidney</u> <u>Chambers and the Shadow of Death</u> by James Runcie. It will be reviewed by Kay Clark.

In the first of the Grantchester Mysteries, and inspiration for the PBS/Masterpiece television show, Sidney Chambers began his career as both a spiritual leader and a detective. It is 1953, the coronation year of Queen Elizabeth II. Sidney Chambers, vicar of Grantchester and honorary canon of Ely Cathedral, is a thirty-two-year-old bachelor. Tall, with dark brown hair, eyes the color of hazelnuts, and a reassuringly gentle manner, Sidney is an unconventional clerical detective. He can go where the police cannot. Together with his roguish friend, Inspector Geordie Keating, Sidney inquires into the suspected suicide of a Cambridge solicitor, a scandalous jewelry theft at a New Year's Eve dinner party, the unexplained death of a jazz promoter's daughter, and a shocking art forgery that puts a close friend in danger. Sidney discovers that being a detective, like being a clergyman, means that you are never off duty, but he nonetheless manages to find time for a keen interest in cricket, warm beer, and hot jazz-as well as a curious fondness for a German widow three years his junior. Happy New Year! We will begin the year by reading <u>Among Friends</u>, by M.F.K. Fisher, the renowned food writer and critic who lived in Whittier while she was growing up. In this poetic, sensitive memoir (originally published in 1971), Fisher traces her life from birth through childhood and into adulthood through memories of her loving family and their lives as outsiders in the Quaker community of Whittier. Recalling the people, passions, sounds, and scents of her childhood, with its kindnesses and quiet cruelties, Fisher also portrays her developing interests in literature, food, and cooking. Elegantly and invitingly written, <u>Among Friends</u> demonstrates the writer's belief that "every lesson, every lecture listened to, must be interpreted into a personal dialect of human language, and that is what I keep trying to do." If you're involved with the Whittier Museum or other organizations concerned with local history, you've probably read this, but it bears rereading!
